UAEM Research Internship: University Report Card Team 2020

UAEM is seeking up to **two part-time student interns** to assist in research, development, design, and data collection and analysis for the 2020 release of our University Report Card Project (available at www.globalhealthgrades.org).

University Report Card: Equity in Biomedical Research

The report card is an analysis of the top 60 research universities nationally on their contributions to global health equity through academic offerings, global access licensing of biomedical discoveries, and prioritization of funding for neglected diseases research. UAEM is specifically seeking individuals with an interest in assisting in data collection and analysis for the Canadian Report Card and planning for the next launch of the US version. The position may also include the opportunity to work on advocacy and social media strategy and related materials for the Report Card, to be utilized by students across UAEM chapters in their campus advocacy.

Areas of work include:

- 1) Researching and analyzing access to medicines policies at the university level -- including interactions between intellectual property, access to treatment in low resource settings, clinical trials transparency and biomedical R&D priorities
- 2) Collaborating with a team of highly motivated UAEM students, staff and other interns to complete data collection and analysis for the Report Card, and working to support the launch of the third version in the US
- 3) Writing explanatory text, press releases, letters, e-mail blasts, articles and briefing papers as well as coming up with an advocacy strategy to publicize UAEM's Report Card Project
- 4) Flexibility to work remote hours, meet deadlines and work with UAEM Executive Director and Report Card team
